World Education Planting Ministry

WEPC (World Education Planting Center) is a missionary organization focused on educational planting, leading the 'One Person, One School' movement to provide church school programs and content for the nurture and growth of the next generation.

1. What is the program about?

The program offered by WEPC is a 7-year English Bible story curriculum designed for children from preschool to elementary school.

This program is an English reading program that:

- 1) uses Bible stories in English,
- ② creates a classroom environment where children are read to (emotionally nurturing and faith-building),
- (3) helps children hear the Gospel with both their minds and hearts, and
- 4) nurtures children who read English books—growing global knowledge learners.

2. How can a school be established?

We provide church education programs and content (a 7-year curriculum with 74 Big Books for instructors) to churches that are seeking church growth or have a heart for next-generation education and mission.



3. How is the school managed once it is established?

Once the *Special Me* (for preschoolers) and *Weavy* (for elementary students) programs are set up, Joanne English provides direct teacher training. Ongoing educational support is offered through regional directors (who provide case-based support), including regular teacher workshops and follow-up training.

4. Where and how is the program being used?

Over 700 schools in more than 30 countries around the world are currently using this program. Since 2024, WEPC has been focusing on supporting education planting in Indonesia.

So far, 65 schools have been established and are actively operating in areas such as Central Java, Bali, Batam, and Jakarta.

Regular teacher training and support are provided through local leaders in each region.

These church schools are thriving as places where Christian leadership is nurtured alongside knowledge and critical thinking.

What's especially remarkable is that many children from outside the church are participating in the program.







5. What changes when a school is established?

Children in the local community who are interested in English reading programs begin to gather at the church, and even their parents start to show interest in church-based education.

Lay leaders can be trained to become teachers, and as the school program continues, it revitalizes Sunday school, contributes to church growth, and becomes a precious gift that introduces the church to the community.

Storytime creates emotionally nurturing moments for children living in the digital screen age. And when a child becomes a reader of English books, they are being raised as global citizens with a strong and healthy faith.

6. How can a school be established through WEPC?

1) Eligibility

Churches with more than 50 children in their Sunday school (or churches with over 200 members who are able to gather that many children) are eligible to apply.

2) How is support provided?

Through Korea's "One Person, One School" movement, a full 7-to-10-year church school curriculum set (from preschool to youth level), worth approximately 2 million KRW, is provided free of charge through 1:1 planting.

Monthly teacher training and support from local ministry leaders are also provided.

Twelve times a year, Korean founders and short-term mission teams visit the planted schools to hold presentations, award ceremonies, revival meetings, and to encourage teachers and pastors.

Local teachers will also participate in regular workshops and receive updated educational content and program support.

7. What are the responsibilities of the established school?

The school must actively promote its establishment in the local community and inform others about the classes and educational programs.

Classes must be held consistently once a week.

Educational activities should be shared online (e.g., Google platform).

The church or individual must cover the cost of student workbooks.

The cost is 75 Cents (US Dollar) per student per month.

(Books are printed locally in Indonesia and are immediately available for purchase.)



8. About the Teaching Materials

The English teacher's materials provided by WEPC include videos, motions, and songs, all perfectly integrated through QR codes printed in the books.

Everything needed for effective education is included.

Each book also contains Bible stories, offering children the opportunity to learn English while encountering God.

These materials are considered superior to any other curriculum distributed globally and are now being recognized as one of the best Christian educational resources available.
